C	A small minority of PPG children have behavioural issues which have a detrimental impact of their academic progress

PPG children (including those with Special Educational Needs) are able to make progress, relative to their starting points.	Children eligible for PPG make good progress Children are able to access the curriculum at their level Higher ability PPG children are able to exceed national expectations
Provide an environment that is conducive to learning, where children are able to access resources to support learning. Provide adult support to complete tasks so that PPG children are not disadvantaged by their home learning environment.	A greater number of PPG children reach age-related expectations compared to 2018 end of KS2 tests Children eligible for PPG are able to access resources (including adult support) that support learning in the classroom and beyond Increased attendance at Homework Club
Behavioural issues of children eligible for PPG are addressed.	Fewer behaviour incidents recorded Behaviour policy is consistently adhered to Attainment of PPG children increases
Children (and their families) with emotional issues are able to access appropriate support from the school and external agencies, where appropriate.	Children have access to mentoring support via Pyramid Club and the school's learning mentor Children (and their families) are able to access counselling support via Working For Children and other external agencies, such as The Children's Society Positive mental health has a positive impact on progress and attainment
Attendance of PPG improves so that it is in line with other children	Attendance of PPG children will be monitored closely and followed up as appropriate Attendance Officer will support specific families as required.
