The spellings this half term start by reviewing words that children would have learnt in Year 4. They will then move onto focussing on the use of the -ough letter string, -cious and -tious endings. The statutory words are taken from the statutory word list for Year 5 and 6.

Focus: Review of Year 4 words

The following words use the rules learnt in Year 4 including spelling words focusing on the use of apostrophes for contractions, -ous and /shun/ sounding words.

Focus: Review of Year 4 words

The following words use the rules learnt in Year 4 including plurals, possessive apostrophes, -ous words, -sure and -ture words, -gue words and alternative spellings of common sounds such as /sh/ spelt as 'ch'.

Focus: -ough letter string

The -ough letter string can be used to spell a variety of different sounds such as /uff/ in rough, tough and enough and /aw/ in fought.

Week beginning: 30th September

Focus: -cious endings

Some words end in -cious. If a word ends in -ce, the -tious sound is usually spelt as a 'c' such as space- spacious, malice- malicious. Anxious is an exception to this rule.

Focus: -tious endings

Some words end in -tious, often when the noun ends in -tion such as caution- cautious.
